7 CORE SERVICES

School Transition Services (PCS Cycle):

School Liaison's (SL's) assist families with school transfers.

Deployment Support: SL's connect educators about the cycles of deployment and the tools available to assist them when working with military children.

Command, School, Community Communications: SL's serve as subjectmatter experts for installation Commanders on PK-12 issues, helping to connect command, school and community resources.

Home School Linkage and Support: SL's assist military families by sharing information on home schooling issues, policies and legislation.

Partnerships in Education (PIE): Creates a volunteer network of resources to support installation and community members who have a vested interest in the success of all youth.

Post-Secondary Preparations: SL's leverage access to post-secondary information and opportunities.

Special Needs System Navigation: SL's work with the Exceptional Family Member Program, providing assistance in navigating the administrative systems within local education agencies.
